"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

Greetings in the Light of the Risen Christ,

"These are _____ times". Fill in the blank with the word that best fits your needs at the moment. For over a month we have not been gathering in our physical church building for worship. For almost a month, we have been living under a "stay-at-home" order. During this time, I have filled the above blank with countless words. Today, I've arrived at the word that, for me, will remain in the blank - "our".

These are our times. While they may be "the best of times" or "the worst of times" (with apologies to Dickens); while these may be "trying" times or "crying" times; "frustrating" times or "anxious" times; "dark" times or "bright" times; they remain our times. Keeping you in the Loop



April 23, 2020

Dear Friends,

I hope you are all doing well during this strange time we are all in. I wanted to give you a brief update on what is happening at St. Andrew's.

I want to assure you that we continue to function, in spite of all the social distancing, staying at home and wearing face masks that we are subject to at present. Let me briefly mention a few.

Paycheck Protection Plan (PPP)

This is part of the CARES ACT, which was passed by the House and signed by the President about 3-4 weeks ago. The Act provides businesses and parishes a low interest loan to cover payroll expenses for a short period, and becomes a grant and will be forgiven providing that borrowers follow the guidelines. We should be getting our loan as soon as the second batch of funds are passed by the House and approved by the President, which is expected at any time now. Our treasurer, Angie Deroche, has been working with our bank on this program.

Comcast

We were notified by Comcast that our current plan for Internet service is becoming obsolete and should be updated. I had several discussions with the Comcast Business Manager. We agreed on a new program that will increase our Internet speed by 25%, and we added two security features. One (Security Edge) will block cyber attacks and complement our current Norton Antivirus Software. The second feature (Connection Pro) is an Internet backup system that assures connectivity in the event of a power failure. They also agreed that we were tax exempt and removed that charge as well. So improvements with minimal cost increase.

Columbia Gas

We made a change to the producer of our gas (Ntherm), which has a lower charge per unit, while delivery remains with Columbia. This change should make it less expensive for our heating needs.

These are just a few examples to show that we continue to operate as normally as possible and manage the needs of the church in spite of our need to stay home. Folks still working include our Secretary, Sandy Albright, who is still on the job, albeit shorter hours. Angie Deroche, Treasurer, continues to manage the finances, paying bills and dealing with the bank on the PPP loan situation. Susan Reardon continues to count on a regular basis and makes deposits to our account. Stacy Sipe will come in if necessary to fill in if needed. So you get the idea. Folks are still manning the fort as we struggle with boredom at home and try and keep healthy and safe. Last, but certainly not least, is our Rector. He is working as much as ever – maybe more in some cases. What a wonderful observance of Holy Week with a Zoom service every night during Holy Week. I can't recall that in the past.

My thanks to all who continue to labor in the trenches during this strange and sad time. We all look forward to getting back together and worshipping at St. Andrew's once again. Until then, keep strong, healthy and safe.

- What does it mean to be "wise in what is good and innocent in what is evil?"

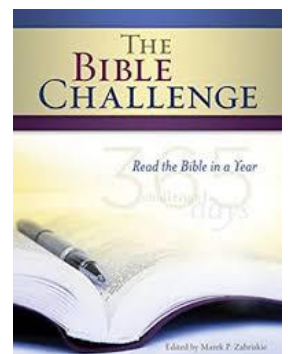
(Romans 16:19)
