Father Barnes served Christ Lutheran Church in Duncannon, Christ Lutheran Church in Elizabethtown, and St. Paul Lutheran Church in Spring Grove while he was a candidate for ministry in the Lower Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. As of February 1, 2019, he serves as Pastor of Shells Evangelical Lutheran Church in Grantville, PA. He is also a member of the Society of the Holy Trinity, The American Guild of Organists, and serves on the AMMPARO Task Force of the Lower Susquehanna Synod of the ELCA.


