READY? SET?...

Our corporate Lenten journey was based on "A Right Beginning". Taken from the Ash Wednesday liturgy, we focused on Lent being an opportunity to once again begin (*I know*, sounds odd, but it works). Throughout Lent, hopefully you found ways to begin again: deepen your relationship with Christ, with loved ones, and, just perhaps, with ones that trouble you. Don't get caught up in whether or not your Lenten journey was a "success". It really doesn't work that way. My prayer for you is that your Lenten journey was just that – movement in a direction that helps you recognize who Christ is to you and the work you need to do to develop that relationship that will, without a doubt, strengthen your relationship with "your neighbors".


When this newsletter is published we will be standing on the threshold of Holy Week. Beginning Palm Sunday (April 2) we will once again actively remember and figuratively walk in the way of Jesus from his final entry into Jerusalem to the Resurrection. Each step of the way – Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and the Day of Resurrection are in their own right "new beginnings" – opportunities to begin again.

Throughout the liturgies of Holy Week and The Great Vigil of Easter, one prayer will be familiar – the prayer which beings "O God of unchangeable power and eternal light" (BCP 280). One of the most striking parts of that prayer is our imploring God to help us recognize "that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made,

your Son Jesus". New beginnings abound. From the Cross of Good Friday, we begin again. From the empty tomb of Easter, we begin again. Each time we feel cast down, we begin again. With time we feel that we are grown old, we begin again. Each time we recognize that we are not perfect, we begin again, and each and every time we begin again the Risen Christ is right there with us as trailblazer and guide.

Holy Week and Easter are full of opportunities to gather in community, walk the way of the Cross, be reminded of the nature of our Salvation through Christ, and countless opportunities to begin again: to begin our walk with Christ again – renewed, strengthen, and beloved. Find ways that work with your schedule to participate as fully in Holy Week and Easter as possible Are you ready? Are you set? A new day dawns with new possibilities. Go!



Vestry Highlights February 28, 2023

- The Vestry welcomed Jenn Fimiani & Frank Youkers.
- Minutes for the January 2023 and Annual Meeting will be approved at our next meeting due to the fact that some packets were sent out late.
- Fr. Grant asked that minutes be read prior to the meetings and that any corrections and additions be sent to the Clerk and him prior to the meetings. This will speed things along.
- Election of Vestry Officers for 2023 term are as follows:

Jr. Warden: John OpiloClerk: Eileen SullivanTreasurer: Angie Deroche

Financial Secretary: Susan Reardon

- The following Ministry Teams were organized for the 2023 term: Finance Committee, Education & Formation, Mission & Outreach, Welcome & Connection (formerly Communication)
- The Vestry approved the Rector's housing allowance for 2023
- The Vestry discussed and approved the Parochial Report for 2023
- The Vestry decided that the monthly meeting time for the Vestry will remain the same (third Tuesday of each month @ 7PM)
- The January Financial report was reviewed by Angie because Susan was absent. It was noted that our pledge income for January was higher than usual at \$29,901. We currently have 56 pledge units monthly with 21 non-pledge units who donate on a regular basis.
- The Vestry acknowledged receipt of two financial bequests received. More information forthcoming from the finance committee and Vestry.
- The treasurer's report noted that we were on target and in a healthy way.
- Jenn brought up a grant that she found available to Episcopal churches. Fr. Grant was aware of this grant and he has already applied for it. If granted it would go to install a new fire and security system and other security features as deemed necessary.
- In his rector's report, Fr. Grant thanked the choir and Phil for their presentation of the February Evensong. In addition, he mentioned the services and studies that are available during Lent.
- Our newly appointed Sr. Warden (Nelson) said that he would like to send out a letter to the parish on a quarterly basis informing them of what is being accomplished and on-going projects. He compared this to the presidential state of the union reports. The vestry applauded this idea.

The next meeting is set for Tuesday March 21st at 7 PM. All Vestry minutes can be found on the bulletin board by the kitchen in the Great Hall.

Vestry Highlights March 21, 2023

- Minutes were approved for January, February, and the Annual Meeting
- The Vestry signed a document that endorsed Martha Ambrose for Ordination to the Diaconate (transitional)
- The Financial Secretary reported that the budget is 92% on target. We have increased our pledges by one from last year plus we have non-pledge members who are consistent in giving. The birthday church for Jan/Feb totaled \$175.
- The treasurer reported that our investments have increased due to the two bequests the parish has recently received. Everything else remains the same.
- Three of the four newly formed ministries have met since their formation. They are currently identifying what we are doing now in relationship to that ministry. Fr. Grant has provided them with workbooks and other resources to help and guide them through this process. These ministry teams act as a support network for what we are doing.
- The Finance Committee have met with Rev. Herb Sprouse (Prince of Peace, Gettysburg) who serves on the diocesan finance committee and also Canon Chad Linder who is a diocesan finance officer.
- Information about what these ministries are doing will be provided monthly to the vestry via minutes.
- Our Senior Warden Nelson will send out a "State of the Parish" letter in April. This is an additional communication to keep parish members in the loop.
- Fr. Grant reviewed services for Holy Week. This is currently posted on our Web page and Face Book.

The next vestry meeting is April 18th at 7 PM in the Great Hall. All vestry minutes can be found on the bulletin board next to the kitchen in the Great Hall.




Fellowship

What is UTO?

Each Lent we see those little blue UTO boxes out on the table. But what does UTO stand for and where does the money we collect go?

UTO stands for United Thanks Offering. It has a long history in the Episcopal Church and was first founded back in the mid 1800's by Julie Chester Emery. At that time the main purpose was

to advance the missionary efforts of the church and to enable women's ministries. Remember this was the Victorian Period!

Today the money is dispensed through Grants. These grants currently focus on human needs at home and around the world. These have included: mobile shower units for the homeless in San Diego; a pre-natal and birthing clinic in South Sudan; renovating church kitchens to bring them up to code in order to feed those in need; translating the Book of Common Prayer and the 1982 Hymnal into several different local languages; and grants to assist with rebuilding after Hurricane Katrina just to name a few.

This Lenten season as you drop a coin into your blue box be thankful for the blessings that are around you. Those coins will become blessings for others in need.
